During Christmas week, SCF Board members were able to bring holiday joy to 94 RCSC Members by distributing your gift cards. I heard something on T.V. just before Christmas that I keep thinking about: "Helping people you may never meet or know is one of the greatest gifts you can give." I want to assure you how much those gift cards are appreciated by your fellow Members. Making these home visits during the holiday season is one of the most rewarding days of volunteer service.

While we always plan and want to do more, with your support we have had a successful year in so many ways. As I write this, we have a couple more weeks of business to conclude so our year-end data isn't final but is forthcoming.

Many Members who are familiar with the foundation know that our key program is **"Neighbors Helping Neighbors" (assisting members with annual assessments).** In 2024, we assisted 67 members (\$35,762.50; as of December 16, 2025, we have assisted 110 residents (\$69,771.00). The final step of the application process includes an in-home visit. Because of this program, our Members can remain in good standing and continue to use the facilities, attend concerts, join clubs and be active participants in our community.

During the first quarter of 2026, the foundation plans to publish an Annual Report that explains, in more detail, the activities of the foundation, accomplishments, overall goals, and a full financial report. Outreach, communication, and transparency are part of our continued goals for the foundation.

As we continue to grow and expand our opportunities, we look forward to your ideas and suggestions. Examples include speakers, classes, beautification projects, or new amenities. As with any small organization, growing pains exist, but we are here to answer questions and provide charitable services to support the programs and services of the Recreation Centers of Sun City.

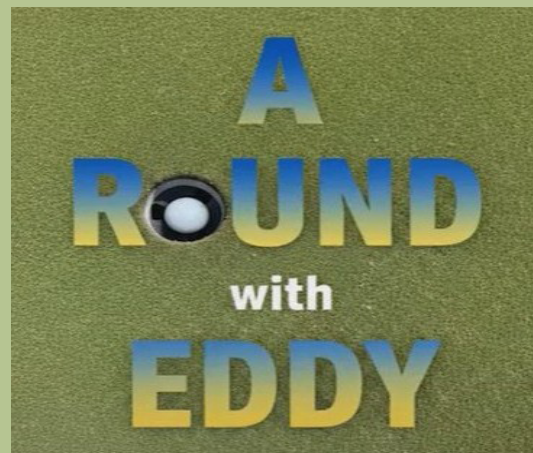

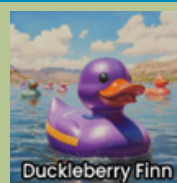


Holiday Concert - Ho-Ho The Christmas Show

- Applicant must be a Member in good standing for the three (3) years prior to applying for assistance unless there are urgent circumstances.
- Income does not exceed 150% of the current Federal Poverty Level (www.aspe.hh.gov/poverty).
- Assessment not more than 60 days past due.

Many Sun City residents think they are members of SCHOA because they pay their annual RCSC mandatory fee. However, SCHOA and the RCSC are two

different organizations. Property owners pay a Preservation and Improvement fee (PIF) and a Capital Improvement fee (CIF) when purchasing a home and then an annual assessment fee, both of which go to the RCSC.

None of this goes to SCHOA.

The **RCSC** maintains anything that has to do with recreation in Sun City, which includes, the Recreation Centers, Pools, Clubs, and Golf Courses.

SCHOA oversees and enforces our mandatory Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs) and works to protect our age overlay and watch over government regulations that may attempt to harm our community. Though our CC&Rs are mandatory for each homeowner in Sun City, who agreed to adhere to them when buying their home, the SCHOA \$25 annual membership fee is voluntary. We are one of the only HOAs in the country that has mandatory adherence but voluntary membership fees.

We hear all the time that people LOVE living in Sun City. They love the clean wide streets, and clean properties which helps their property values.

One of the main reasons for the look and feel of the community is because SCHOA enforces the CC&Rs. If you are a Sun City resident but are not a SCHOA member we encourage you to join us. If you aren't sure if you are a member, please give us a call at 623.974.4718, we'll be happy to check your status.

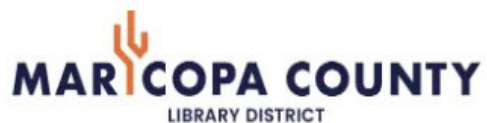

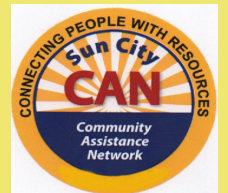

The Sun City Fire District dba **Sun City Fire and Medical Department** was established in 1966, as the new retirement community of Sun City was established. The District provides fire and emergency medical services for the communities of Sun City, the Town of Youngtown, and Citrus Point.

The Fire Department has grown to include 3 fire stations, an administrative headquarters, seven pieces of apparatus, six ambulances and two command vehicles, to cover 17 square miles and a population of over 47,000 people. The Sun City Fire and Medical Department provides the following services:

- Fire suppression and prevention.
- Emergency medical services.
- Community services and volunteer program.
