It's a place where wins are celebrated, losses are laughed off, and every session ends with people already looking forward to the next deal.

Sun City Artists by the Lake Club

The vision of the **Sun City Artists by the Lake Club** is to create an inviting, supportive environment that meets the needs of the members through art education and opportunities that provide pleasure, personal growth, and the promotion of artistic talents. **We are based on the second floor of the Lakeview Center, which is located at 10626 W. Thunderbird Blvd. The Art Room is next to the Carvers Club and is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.** Membership is open to any current RCSC Member for \$10 a year, which is due in January. The club meets monthly on the first Tuesday of the month in Social Hall #1 for a short business meeting followed by an artist demonstration.

We welcome all levels of expertise. We offer a variety of classes in many levels of watercolor, oil, acrylic, pastel, drawing, and collage. We have at least one yearly Juried Art Show that members in good standing may participate. Periodically, we have painting challenges to get members excited about new painting ideas. There is a gallery in the Art Room where members can hang their artwork to sell.



Once a year we host an annual Spring Fine Art Show and members are invited to participate. We also show artwork at the annual Fall Arts and Crafts Festival in November and in the gallery of the art room.

Mountain View Center Renovation Update

RCSC Board of Directors voted on Member-driven "Option 3B plus"

Did you know the **Mountain View Recreation Center** was the third center built in Sun City by Del E. Webb? Some Members describe it as a hidden gem enjoyed by many over the past 50+ years. Fast forward to today and RCSC is making excellent progress of the strategic evaluation, planning, analysis, and community outreach to renovate this historic center.

On January 29, 2026, the RCSC Board of Directors voted to move forward with the Mountain View Center renovation with "Option 3B plus," with added scope from the original site program elements. The adjustments include the following:

- **Everything in *Option 3B plus (see note below)**
- **New clubhouse (instead of renovating)**
- **New mini-golf building (instead of renovating)**
- **Increase of "all-in" budget to \$30.1M**
