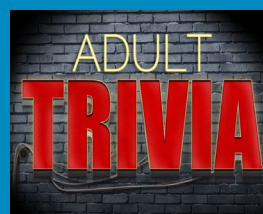

4. Reside in Sun City, Arizona, and be physically in residence at least ten (10) months of the year;
5. Be willing and available to serve one of the open terms; and
6. Attend in person or electronically the required Board Candidate Orientation session(s).

A Message from the RCSC Board of Directors

Purpose Does Not Retire: Resident-Led Leadership Continues to Shape the Future of Sun City

In Sun City, retirement isn't the end of contribution—it's the beginning of a new kind of leadership. For residents of Sun City, serving on the Recreation Centers of Sun City (RCSC) Executive Board or a committee offers a meaningful way to use a lifetime of professional experience to strengthen the community we share.

Founded in 1960, Sun City was built on the idea that retirement should be active, purposeful, and self-directed. That vision continues today through resident involvement. Our community thrives because residents step forward to help guide its future.

Importantly, this is not a return to the pressures of full-time employment. Committee service allows focused involvement in specific areas of interest. Board service provides broader oversight and strategic direction. Both offer structured, manageable commitments that respect the freedom retirement provides.

Sun City has always been a resident-driven community. Strong governance protects property values, ensures transparency, and maintains the recreational lifestyle that draws people here. When experienced individuals volunteer, the entire community benefits from sound decision-making and thoughtful leadership.

Beyond the practical impact lies something even more valuable: fulfillment. Leadership service reinforces identity. It reminds us that our knowledge and judgment still matter. It creates opportunities to mentor others and contribute to a lasting legacy.

Retirement brings freedom—freedom from deadlines and corporate demands. It also brings the freedom to choose meaningful engagement. Serving on the Board or a committee is more than volunteering. It is stewardship of the community where we live, connect, and thrive.

Purpose does not retire. In Sun City, it simply takes on new meaning.

Outreach & Communications Committee (OCC) On the Move (Literally!)

This spring, Rebecca Hill, the General Manager of the Recreation Centers of Sun City (RCSC) tasked the Outreach and Communication Committee (OCC) with visiting welcome and visitor centers in other 55-plus communities throughout the Valley to compare how neighboring communities introduce prospective residents to their amenities and lifestyle. As part of the review, OCC members visited approximately 10 communities throughout Maricopa County.



Committee members agreed that Sun City's Welcome Center compared very favorably to those visited and stood out as one of the best staffed and most comprehensive operations reviewed. Volunteers were praised for their knowledge, enthusiasm, and ability to provide information not only about recreation facilities, but also local organizations, services, housing, and the many unique aspects of Sun City.

"Our volunteers are truly the heart of the Welcome Center," one OCC member commented. "Visitors leave with a strong sense of what makes Sun City special."

One OCC member also shared the rich history of the Visitors Center, which opened on April 19, 2002, and over the years has become nationally and internationally recognized for representing the uniqueness of Sun City.

The Welcome Center offers information on Sun City clubs, events, churches, golf courses, and many community resources. Visitors can participate in the "Sun City Experience," a 90-minute informational session that includes a walking tour of Bell Recreation

Center and a 24-minute video presentation highlighting Sun City's recreation centers, active lifestyle options, and community organizations. The Sun City Experience sessions are offered twice monthly by appointment.

The committee also identified opportunities for improvement, including increased signage visibility, expanded social media outreach, keeping printed materials updated and organizing material in a more community-focused way. Volunteers also expressed interest in strengthening the center's Facebook presence to better connect with prospective residents online. This is currently under review with management.

As the OCC continues its work, members emphasized the importance of involving current Welcome Center volunteers in future planning discussions because of their firsthand experience working with visitors.

The OCC's review reinforced what many residents already know — Sun City's Welcome Center continues to serve as an important gateway to the community, helping visitors discover the active lifestyle, connections, and opportunities that make Sun City unique.

As Sun City continues evolving, the OCC remains committed to identifying ways to strengthen communication, outreach, and visitor engagement while preserving the welcoming atmosphere that has defined the community for decades.

RCSC History: Sundial Recreation Center

The RCSC Sundial Recreation Center is known for the massive outdoor sundial, which is the tallest sundial built in the Southwestern United States. Sun City's fifth center was also the largest built by the Del E. Webb Construction Company so far. Sitting on nearly 10 and a half acres of land, the complex includes two buildings connected by a breezeway, totaling 73,000 square feet of space.

Construction began in 1972 and its major components include the largest auditorium in Sun City and the largest indoor pool in the state. Once again, the goal was to create something spectacular...and they did.

The center's grand opening was April 1973 and just like the other center openings, it was a great success! It's no surprise that the huge indoor pool stole the spotlight that day. Flash forward 52 years and the pool is still stunning, though a little different today. Gone are the artificial trees and vines, and a second pool has been added. It's still the only indoor pool complex in Sun City and is always in demand.

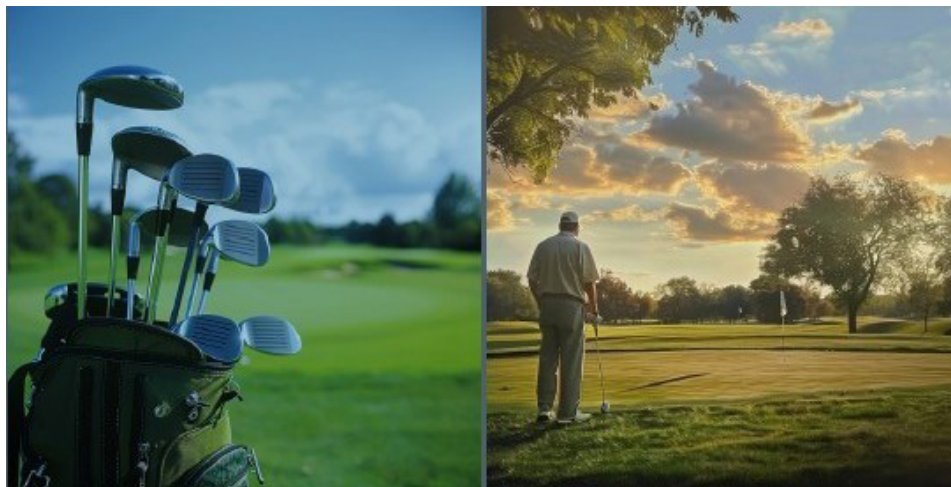

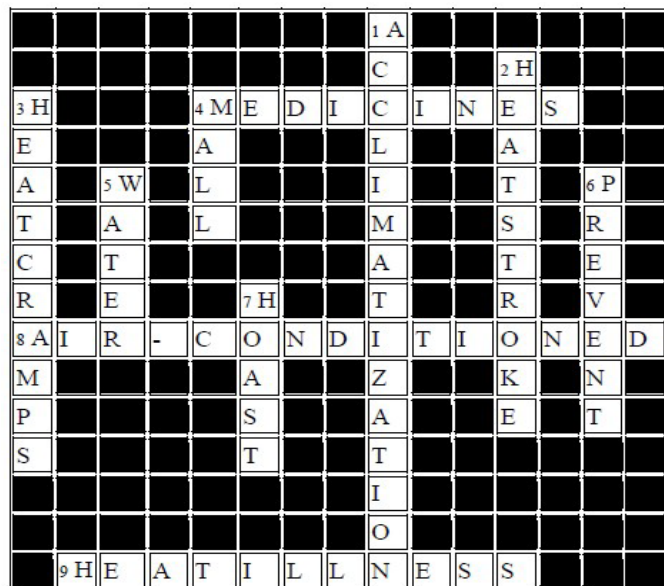

MCSO SCAM ALERT

RCSC Members, please be aware that the Donation Reply Form titled "Citizens Behind the Badge (CBB) – Sun City Area Community Police Alert" is a SCAM.



The Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) Financial Crimes Unit warns residents AGAINST giving money or personal information to this organization in any way, especially using the QR Code, the PO Box address, or online payment platform provided on the form.

MCSO and local law enforcement agencies advise they have NO affiliation with these solicitation campaigns. Although "Citizens Behind the Badge" (CBB) is a real organization, it is a politically focused 501(c)(4) social welfare group, NOT a charity. MCSO warns it is used as a front in widespread donation scams targeting residents with fake requests for support.

MCSO and other local law enforcement agencies have confirmed they do NOT endorse these mailers or calls and that donated money often goes to scammers, not actual law enforcement support.

Key Details:

- Scam Operation: Mailers and calls from "Citizens Behind the Badge (CBB)" are often scams, using the trust in law enforcement to trick people into donating money that ends up with fraudsters.
- Law Enforcement Disavowal: MCSO and many local law enforcement agencies have confirmed they do NOT solicit donations through CBB and warn residents against giving money or personal information to them.

What to Do:

- Do NOT Donate: If you receive calls or mail from "Citizens Behind the Badge (CBB)," they are NOT endorsed by MCSO or any other local law enforcement agencies. MCSO warns against donating to any organization which sends unsolicited mailers.

Verify Directly: If you wish to support your local law enforcement agencies, contact those local agencies directly, NOT through unsolicited calls or mailers.

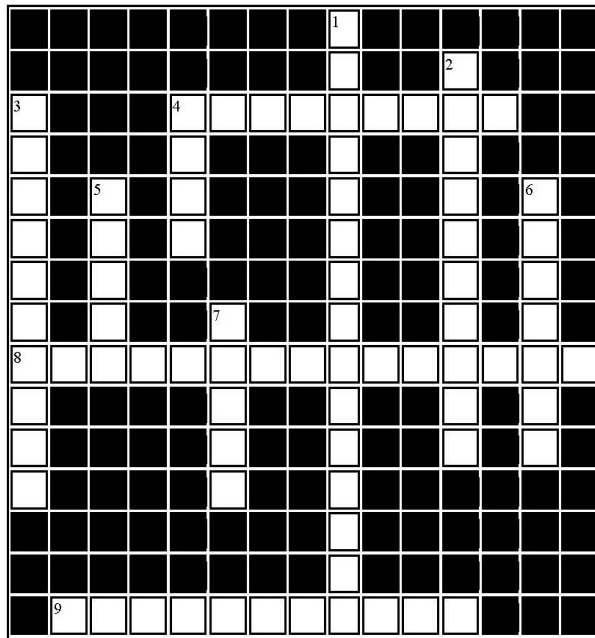

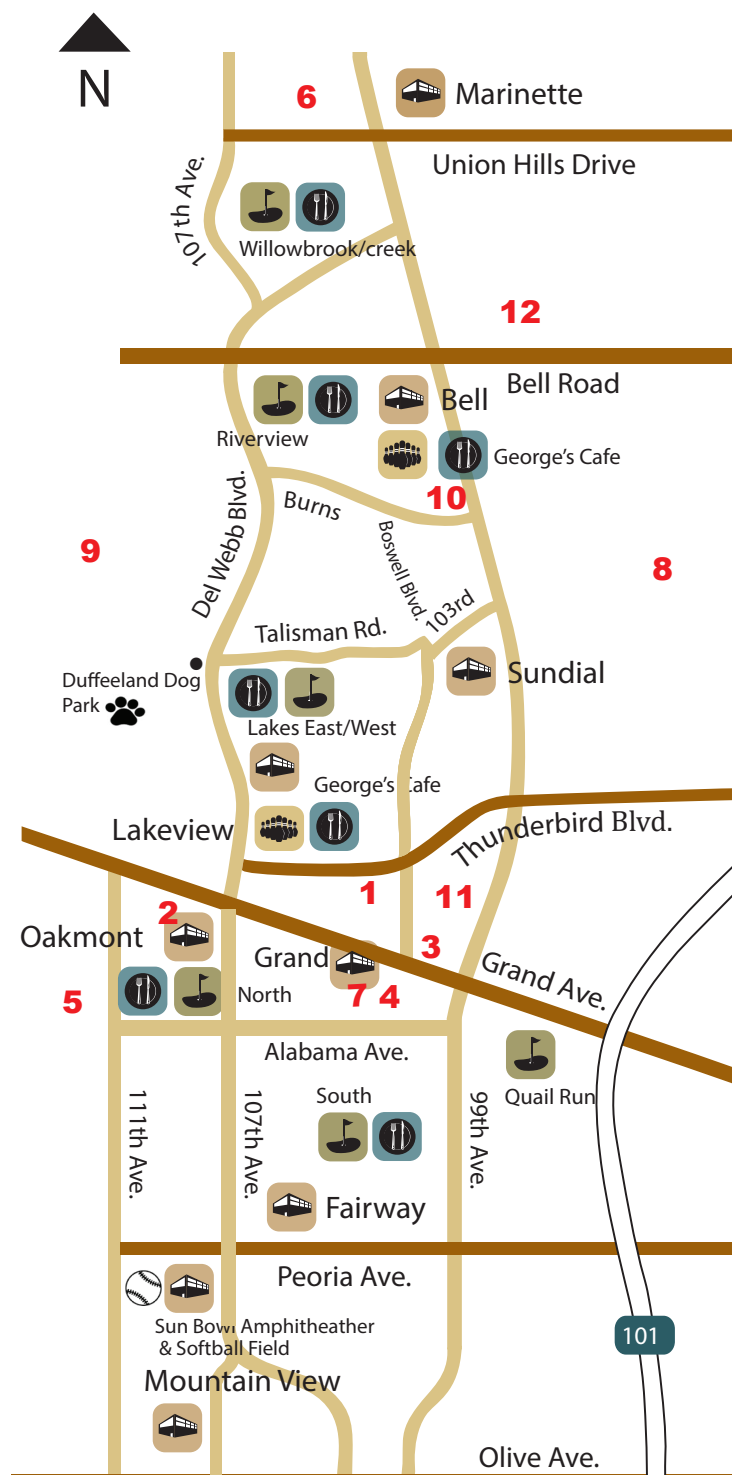

Planning Responsibly for RCSC's Future



Maintaining the high-quality facilities, programs, services, and experiences that members enjoy throughout Sun City requires thoughtful long-term planning, collaboration, and responsible stewardship. Since February 5, representatives from committees across the Recreation Centers of Sun City (RCSC) have been meeting twice monthly as part of the organization's 5-Year Planning Team to evaluate future RCSC operational needs, service expectations, infrastructure priorities, and long-term financial sustainability.

To date, the team met approximately eight times. Each representative brought forward the perspectives and priorities of the committee they represent—collectively reflecting the voices of more than 100 committee members throughout RCSC. Together, committee representatives, leadership, and staff reviewed operational trends, future needs, and factors impacting the organization's ability to continue supporting the active lifestyle and member experience that RCSC provides.

It is important to note that the 5-Year Planning Team's discussions focused specifically on RCSC operating and capital forecasts. These forecasts relate to the Recreation Centers of Sun City and its facilities and services, and should not be interpreted as projections for Sun City as a whole community.

As with many organizations and households, RCSC continues to experience rising operational costs in areas such as utilities, insurance, employee healthcare benefits, safety compliance, and ongoing facility maintenance. The purpose of the 5-Year Planning process has been to proactively evaluate these realities while continuing to preserve the quality, services, amenities, and experiences members value.

At its most recent meeting, the 5-Year Planning Team unanimously agreed that its work was complete. With the conclusion of its review, the team's recommendations will now move forward into the established governance process. The Finance, Budget, and Audit Committee will review and refine the recommendations as part of the annual budget development process. In addition, Long Range Planning will review the proposed Preservation and Improvement Fee (PIF) project list. Following these steps, recommendations will be forwarded to the Board of Directors for consideration. No final recommendations or decisions have been approved at this stage. RCSC remains committed to transparent communication throughout the process and will continue providing updates to members as appropriate. Future town hall presentations for membership engagement and discussion are also being planned, with additional information to be shared once available.

Thoughtful planning today helps support the long-term sustainability, stability, and member experience that continue to make RCSC a vibrant and active organization within Sun City.
