

E-CHECKS: Keep More Dollars in RCSC!

A Simple Choice. A Big Community Impact.

Every year, your annual assessment helps support the recreation centers, golf courses, amenities, programs, and facility improvements that make Sun City an exceptional place to live and enjoy an active lifestyle.

When it comes time to pay your annual assessment, you have several payment options, including credit card, check, and e-check. While the amount you pay remains exactly the same regardless of the payment method you choose, the processing cost to RCSC is significantly different.

For a \$680 annual assessment:

- *Credit card payment: Approximately \$24 processing fee paid by RCSC*
- *Check or e-check payment: Approximately \$2 processing fee paid by RCSC*

While the difference is approximately \$22 per transaction, the impact grows substantially when multiplied across thousands of assessment payments.

In 2025, approximately 12,000 members paid their annual assessment by credit card, resulting in approximately \$284,000 in credit card processing fees paid by RCSC. If those same payments had been made by check or e-check, the processing cost would have been approximately \$24,000.

That represents a potential annual savings of approximately \$260,000.

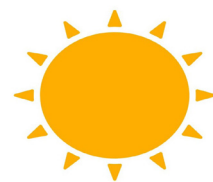
Keeping those dollars within RCSC means more resources can be invested in maintaining and enhancing the amenities, facilities, programs, and future improvements that benefit the entire community.

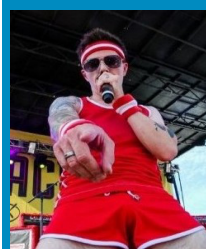

From Birdies to Bowling: A Golf Champion's Next Chapter Right Here at RCSC

Sun City is known for its excellent golf courses, but some Members and staff may not know that we're in the company of excellence in the game of golf. Janet Anderson, RCSC Member and Bell Recreation Center staff member, won the U.S. Women's Open championship in 1982. She was the winner by six career-changing strokes.

Janet's interest in golf began in her teen years. "My dad got me into golf when I was 13; he and I started golf together," she shared. Over time, Janet perfected her skills. She did two years of college and then joined the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) tour in 1978. During her career, she won more than forty top ten finishes on the LPGA tour.

Janet shared that she did a lot of traveling on tour. "I visited almost every state in the U.S., and I got to play in Japan three times. Back then I had to make all the tour and travel arrangements and I had to learn how to depend on myself. You can't replace that kind of (life) experience. My professional (golf) career was from the age of 22 to 42, which was a huge period of growth for me."

During this time, women's golf was also experiencing a period of growth. "I played during a transitional stage of awareness for women's golf. Back then, only major events were televised and now every event is on T.V.," she said. "I'm proud to say that I was part of that transformational time for women in golf."

After a successful 20-year career on the LPGA tour, Janet never left the fairway – she simply took her game to the business side of golf. "After I retired in 1998, I then went to work part-time at Cave Creek Golf Course. After that I was the head golf professional at Aguila Golf Course, through City of Phoenix," stated Janet. "I gave lessons at Aguila and worked with high school golf teams...was a real treat!"

In 2018 and 2019, several life changes happened. She decided to retire from the working world, she tore a ligament in her wrist, and she moved to Sun City. "After retiring from playing and teaching golf, I needed something to fill my competitive spirit. Now I work part-time at RCSC's Bell Lanes, and I have a love of bowling. I'm on two leagues and I've met so many great people at the Bell Center."

Janet's competitive spirit never retired; it simply exchanged golf clubs for a bowling ball. We're happy that she's made meaningful new connections and found her new passion right here at RCSC.

Behind Every Perfect Green: RCSC's Grounds Teams Prepares for Lawn Bowling

When competitors from around the world arrive in Sun City this November for the U.S. National Lawn Bowling Tournament, they'll see something that many consider among the finest playing surfaces in North America.

What they won't see is the months of planning, precision, and dedication that go into making those greens tournament ready.

For RCSC Grounds Superintendent Scott Jones, preparing the lawn bowling greens isn't just another assignment—it's a craft he's spent more than a decade perfecting.

"I've been doing this for 10 years," Jones said. "Everything we do is about creating greens that are true."

In lawn bowling, "true" means consistency. Every bowl should travel exactly as intended, without unexpected deflections caused by uneven turf. Achieving that level of precision requires far more than routine mowing.

The greens are maintained on a carefully planned rotation. Three greens are mowed and rolled each day, ensuring every grass green receives meticulous attention every other day. In addition to mowing, specialized grooming equipment removes excess thatch to thin the turf and increase green speed—one of the most important factors in competitive lawn bowling.

"It's all about speed," Jones explained. "The bowl has to roll true."

That precision starts long before tournament week. Jones studied turf management through the University of Georgia and applies those principles every day. From hand-watering dry areas and carefully monitoring irrigation to fertilization, aerification, grooming, rolling, and mowing, every task is performed with a specific purpose.

Even something as simple as mowing requires remarkable accuracy.

"You can't overlap. You can't leave gaps," Jones said. "Everything has to be exactly right."

The lawn bowling greens are only part of the Grounds team's responsibilities. The crew also maintains the landscaping, trees, shrubs, irrigation systems, and outdoor spaces across RCSC's recreation centers.

While Members often arrive to beautifully maintained facilities, much of the work happens long before anyone steps onto the property.

Caring for our Golf Courses: A Proactive Approach to Turf Health



Some golfers have noticed brown and bare areas on the greens at Willowcreek following the recent aerification process. While these conditions may appear concerning, they are the result of a proactive turf management program designed to improve the long-term health and playability of the course.

This year presented unique growing conditions. Warmer-than-normal temperatures during the fall and spring allowed weeds such as nutsedge and goosegrass to continue growing when they would typically go dormant. As a result, these invasive weeds became more established than in a typical season.

Although the course appeared to be in good condition before aerification, our Golf Course Maintenance team recognized that delaying treatment would have allowed the weeds to spread further, particularly with monsoon season approaching. Addressing the issue now helps protect the long-term quality of the turf.

The weed control products used to target these invasive grasses can temporarily cause Bermuda turf to brown. In addition, areas where weeds have been removed may appear bare until the healthy Bermuda grass naturally fills in. With summer heat, humidity, and seasonal rainfall, we expect the Bermuda to recover and continue strengthening throughout the season.

Weed management is an important part of maintaining healthy golf course conditions and is a challenge faced annually by golf courses throughout the Valley. While the severity can vary from year to year depending on weather patterns, proactive treatment is essential to maintaining strong, consistent playing surfaces.

Our goal is to establish a dense, healthy Bermuda base that provides the best possible foundation for fall overseeding. Investing in the health of the turf now results in improved course conditions, stronger winter grass, and a quicker, more successful transition back to Bermuda next summer.

Golfers may notice similar conditions at other RCSC golf courses as each maintenance team follows this same proactive approach. While temporary browning and thin areas are part of the process, these treatments help create healthier, more resilient turf for the seasons ahead.

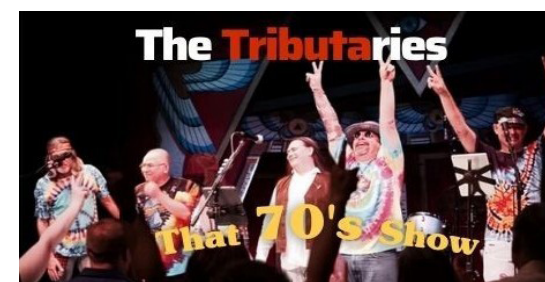

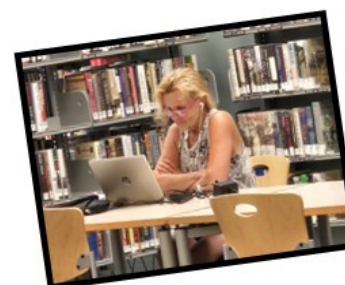

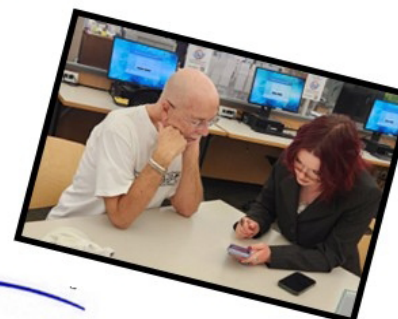

A Friendly Reminder About Pets at RCSC



We know many of our Members enjoy spending time with their dogs. To help keep everyone safe, please remember:

Pets are not allowed inside RCSC facilities, except for:

- ADA-defined service animals
- Dogs participating in Best Friends Dog Club
- Dogs visiting Duffeeland Dog Park

If your dog comes with you while you visit an RCSC facility:

- Never leave your dog in a parked vehicle. Even with the windows open, temperatures inside a vehicle can become dangerous very quickly.
- Bring plenty of fresh water for your dog when you're out and about.
- Check the pavement before walking your dog. If it's too hot for your hand, it's too hot for your dog's paws.
- Whenever possible, visit during the cooler morning or evening hours.

Arizona law protects animals from being left in unsafe conditions. Thank you for helping keep our pets, Members, guests, volunteers, and employees safe.

Sun City Fire and Medical Department: Smoke Detector Program

Did you know the Sun City Fire and Medical Department can install a smoke detector in your home for free?



They can install your detector, replace an existing one or install a new one in homes without a smoke detector.

During this process, Sun City Fire will not disconnect any smoke detectors that are connected to the homes power supply, but can assist in replacing batteries in the smoke detectors.

As part of their Smoke Detector Program, Sun City Fire performs a Home Safety Survey to help identify safety concerns in your home using a 38-point checklist to highlight any safety areas needing attention.

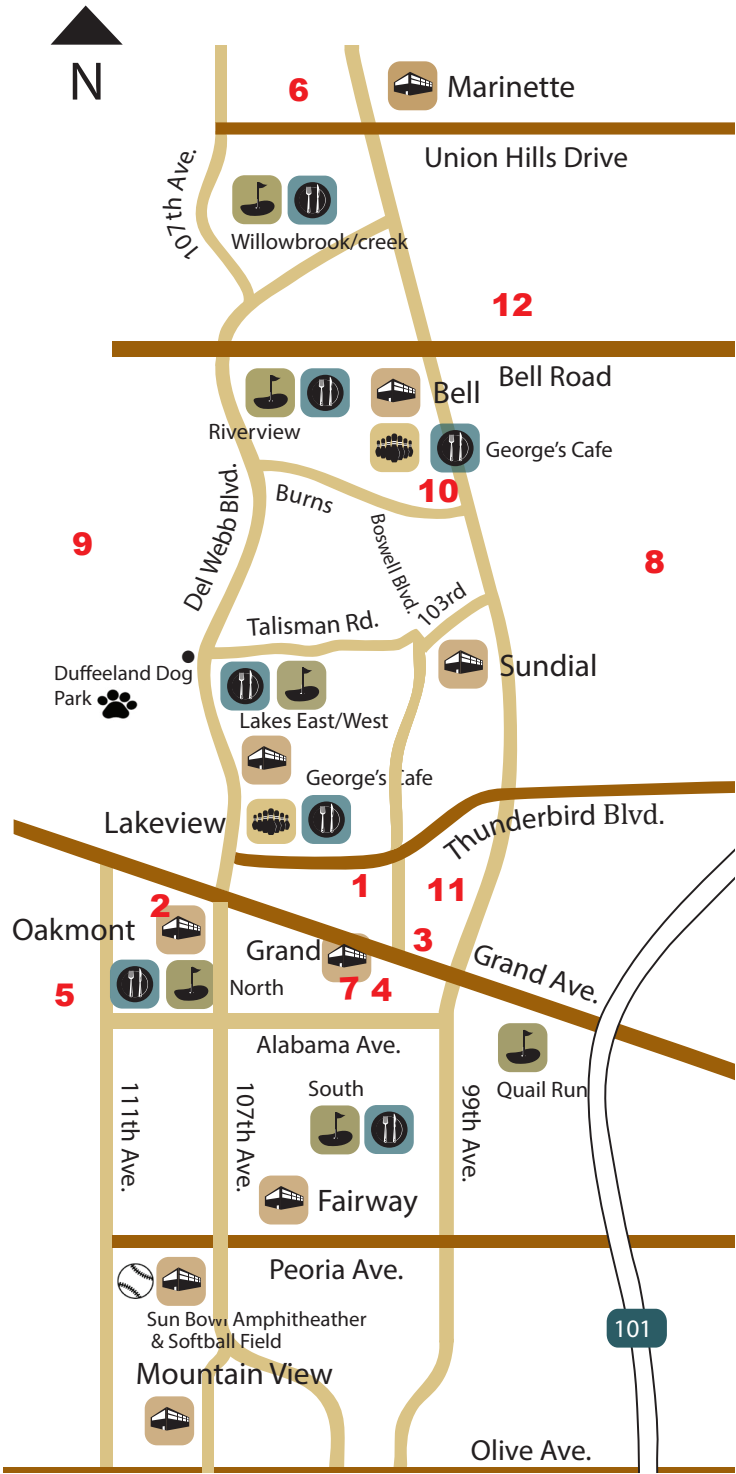

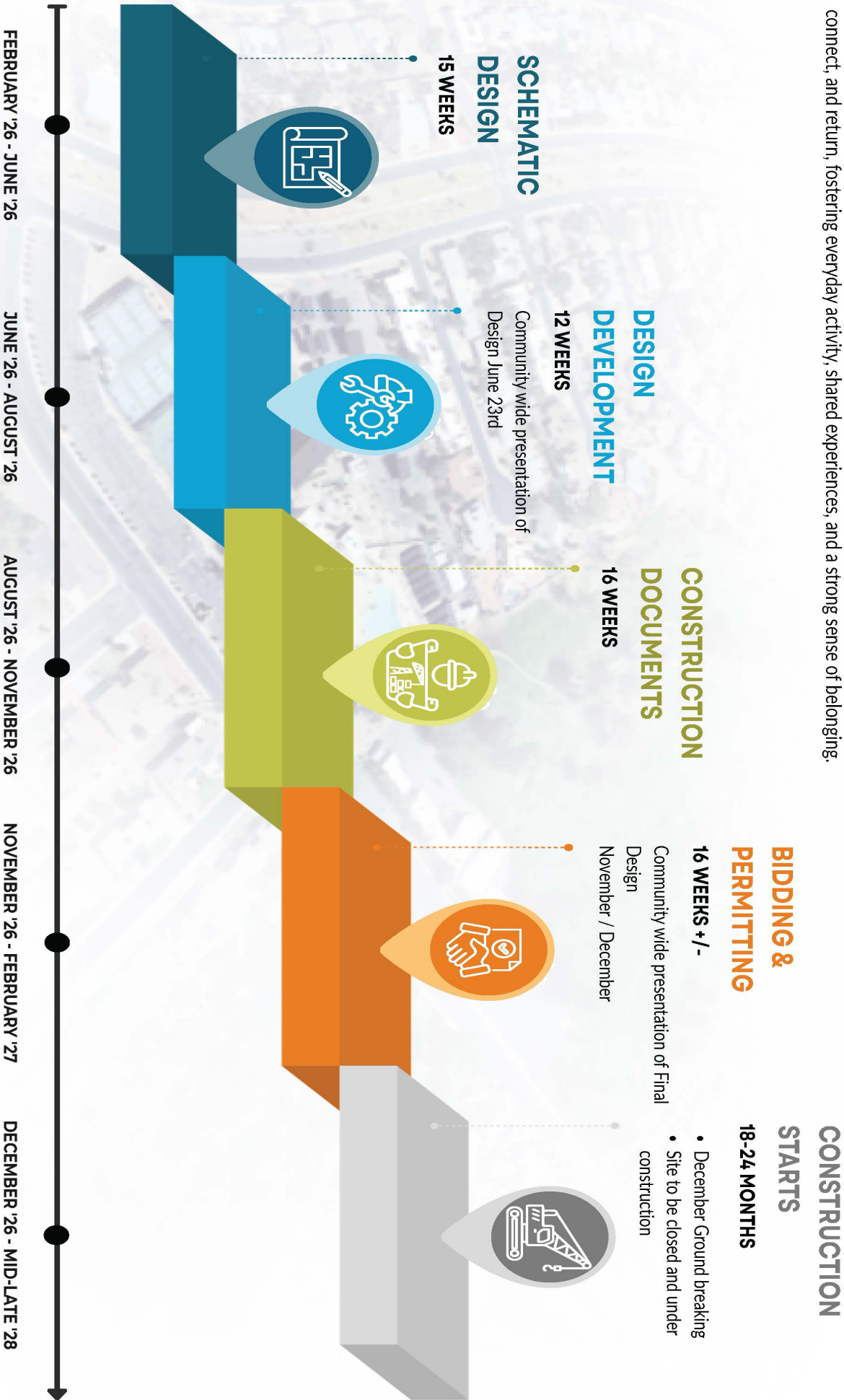
